Be advised: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All United States Military Academies require 2 years of a foreign language ● All United States Military Academies (except the Coast Guard) require a recommendation from a U.S. senator, member of the US House of Representatives, or the Vice President of the United States. You should reach out to a congressional representative's Constituent Services office to begin the process during your junior year ● All United States Military Academies develop career military officers. Consequently, they look for team captains, student government members, community service, and well-rounded athletic involvement.
